Overview




- ✓ Alternative to the federal graduation rate
- ✓ Addresses limitations of federal grad rate:
 - Includes more students: first-time full-time and full-time transfer-in cohorts
 - Provides more outcomes: graduated from original institution or another institution, and still enrolled at original institution or another institution

VSA Success & Progress Rate



✓ Outcomes are reported at both 4-years and 6-years after initial enrollment



VSA Success & Progress Rate



- ✓ Starting last year, institutions can create S&P Rates for additional cohorts
 - Veterans
 - Low-income / Pell eligible students
 - First generation students


What is SAM?

- Voluntary alternative to federal graduation rate, provides more realistic picture of student outcomes
- Cross-sector effort sponsored by six DC higher education associations - open to private and public colleges, universities and community colleges
- Two models: 1) bachelor's model based on S&P rate,
 2) associate/certificate model based on VFA progress and outcomes measure
- Another opportunity for VSA participants to display a more comprehensive outcomes measure!



Bachelor's Model (based on VSA Success & Progress Rate)

SAM Institution Example: Students Seeking a Bachelor's Degree



Two Cohorts

- First-time, full-time bachelor's degree seeking students (IPEDS, SRK definition)
- Full-time, transfer-in students, first time at institution

Three Time Periods

After 4 years, 5 years, 6 years


Five Outcomes

- Graduated: Original
- Transferred & Graduated: Other
- Enrolled: Original
- Transferred & Enrolled: Other
- Unknown



Associate/Certificate Model (based on VFA Progress & Outcomes Measure)

SAM Institution Example: Students Seeking an Associate's Degree or Certificate



- Graduated: Original Institution
- Enrolled: Original Institution
- Transferred: Other Institution
- Current Status Unknown

Two Cohorts:

- Full-time degree or certificate seeking students, first-time at institution
- Part-time degree or certificate seeking students, first-time at institution

One Time Period

After 6 years

Four Outcomes

- Graduated: Original
- Enrolled: Original
- Transferred: Other
- Unknown
